



## Promoting Opportunities Protecting Rights For Older Victorians



Media Release: SRV, ECCV collaborate to train new Elder Abuse Bilingual Community Educators

**Melbourne, 15 May 2023** - A new group of Elder Abuse Bilingual Community Educators were trained last week by Seniors Rights Victoria (SRV), in collaboration with the Ethnic Communities Council of Victoria (ECCV).

ECCV's Elder Abuse Prevention Community Education training program is designed to prepare members of culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) communities to deliver community education on elder abuse.

SRV's collaboration with the ECCV's Elder Abuse Program has existed for several years; hundreds of Bilingual Community Educators have successfully completed a specially designed two-day program.

"Training cultural educators to raise awareness of elder abuse in CALD communities within the state is a very important part of the prevention program at Seniors Rights Victoria," said SRV Manager and Principal Lawyer, Avital Kamil.

Equipped with training and dedicated, culturally-appropriate resources in a range of community languages, the Bilingual Community Educators work with a variety of seniors' organisations and community groups to help prevent elder abuse and safeguard the rights, independence, and dignity of older people.

"The critical role SRV plays in our communities across Victoria cannot be overstated," said CEO of COTA Victoria and Seniors Rights Victoria, Chris Potaris. "A lot of the educational work we're undertaking at SRV is significantly underfunded, resulting in a blow out to our response and waiting times for older Victorians seeking our services, currently, that waiting list stands at 5 weeks.

"We've also seen a steep rise in the number of calls received to our Helpline over the past few months, that rise equates to a 39% increase and is putting significant pressure on our services, staff, and the people most at risk."

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The training comes ahead of <u>World Elder Abuse Awareness Day (WEAAD</u>), which takes place annually on 15 June. Seniors Rights Victoria will be hosting several events around Victoria as the world unites to voice its opposition to physical, social, financial, psychological, or sexual abuse inflicted upon older people.

Seniors Rights Victoria encourages those around Victoria, Australia and the world to host events raising awareness of WEAAD. A list of existing events, and the ability to register your own event, is available through <u>the WEAAD website</u>.
